What data do we collect?

Ohms collect the following data on individuals and companies in order to carry out our tasks defined in the contract between Ohms and you, the supplier, customer or client:

- Name(s)
- Address(s)
- Telephone Number(s)
- Email Address(es)
- Financial details including bank details(s)
- Signatures
- Details of job

How do we collect your data?

You directly provide Ohms with your data – we use no third-party sources. We collect and process your data when you:

- Make communication with us (by paper/post, telephone, email, instant messaging services)
- Communicate with us in person.

How do we use your data?

We use your data for you to, or for us to fulfil your/our contractual obligations with Ohms. We also use your data to set up a contract between yourselves and Ohms.

How will we store your data?

Ohms uses a mixture of both physical and digital security methods (such as secured premises and password protection) to store your data locally and with approved cloud suppliers.

We will keep your data for as many years that current legislation allows and deems necessary and for as long as the contact between you and Ohms stipulates. Ohms does not store data unnecessarily.

Ohms uses Google as its approved cloud data storage and processing provider.

Where do we share your data?

Ohms will only share your data where it is absolutely necessary to do so in order to carry out any contractual obligations. We will only share the minimum amount of data that is required to carry out those duties and all data shared is processed in line with Ohms procedures.

We may share the following information:

- Name(s)
- Address(s)
- Telephone Number(s)
- Email Address(es)
- Financial details including bank details(s)

- Signatures
- Details of job

With approved suppliers such as:

- Suppliers of equipment
- Contracted workers, drivers or driver's mates

What are your data protection rights?

Under the Data Protection legislation, data subjects have the following rights with regards to their personal information:

- the right to be informed about the collection and the use of their personal data
- the right to access personal data and supplementary information
- the right to have inaccurate personal data rectified, or completed if it is incomplete
- the right to erasure (to be forgotten) in certain circumstances
- the right to restrict processing in certain circumstances
- the right to data portability, which allows the data subject to obtain and reuse their personal data for their own purposes across different services
- the right to object to processing in certain circumstances
- rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling
- the right to withdraw consent at any time (where relevant)
- the right to complain to the Information Commissioner

If you make a request to Ohms regarding your data, we have one month (30 days) to respond to you. See the 'How to Contact Us' section for contact details.
